## *ESUUC Sunday Services*

**Sunday, May 4<sup>th</sup> 10:30 AM – “The Agony and The Ecstasy of Pastoral Ministry”** – Dr. Waun observes the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of her call to ministry this spring, and reflects upon the many adventures she has had in pastoral ministry since her ordination. Sometimes there are unavoidable ethical dilemmas that come with the job. She will share several stories, including “Renee Agrees to Disguise Herself as a Man”, “Hiring a Call Girl for Uncle Ray”, and why a funeral director once said, “Renee, I’m gonna kill you”. You will have an opportunity to respond as to what you might have done in these situations and others.

**Sunday, May 18<sup>th</sup> 10:30 AM – “The Transcendent Experience”** – Presented by Andy Manhardt. ### *“Come and Chant” in June*

June's meditation will be held on **June 1<sup>st</sup>** at the church at **7:30 PM**.

We will be chanting in the Yogic tradition with a special guest Yamuna Devi. Yamuna was inspired during a chanting retreat with Krishna Das in 2002 to start “Project: Chant!” where she leads individuals at gatherings known as Kirtan in chants in the yogic tradition. She does this at supporting Yoga studios. This will be the first time she be a guest in a church.

Each program consists of a number of different chants, usually in the language of Sanskrit. Brief instruction in pronunciation and translation is given. The chants are done in what is known as “Call and Response” format -- the leader chants/sings a passage, and the group mirrors it back. Chants usually begin with a slow, mellow feel, and gradually build in tempo and volume, hitting a peak before again slowing, and dropping off into silence.

Most of the chants done by “Project: Chant!” are based on the work of Krishna Das, Jai Uttal, and Yogi Hari. One does not need to have musical ability of any kind to participate in Kirtan. Can't Sing? Doesn't matter -- chanting is different than singing. The main skill required in chanting is the ability to listen. The only other requirement is to participate!
