Annual Gandhi Celebration

On Sunday, October 3, from 3-4:30PM at the **Interfaith Center of Carlow College** in Oakland there will be a celebration in honor of the birthday of Mohandas K. Gandhi. Several organizations including a number of churches from the Monroeville Interfaith Ministerium will be planning and participating in this event. Rev. Waun is again on the planning committee. This year's speaker is the first Hindu to be appointed to the Commission on International Religious Freedom, former NY solicitor general **Preeta Bansal**. She is described as being an advocate and role model of the spirit of Gandhi. An interfaith panel will respond to Bansal's talk before incorporating questions from the audience. As we think about the world situation today, Gandhi's teachings are especially important. We hope you agree and will attend this worthy event.

Dr. Waun at Ligonier Valley

Beginning this fall, our minister Dr. Renee Waun will be spending one Sunday every month speaking at the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Ligonier Valley. Organized as a fellowship in 1988, UUFLV now has about 50 adult members. They moved to their new building about a year and a half ago, and have been enjoying a growth spurt since that time. In June when Dr. Waun was there last, they recognized 5 new members. It is a small congregation with many of the same issues that we face here at ESUUC. Now we share a ministerial connection as well.



When I was staying in the youth hostel in Barcelona in July, things were so expensive due to the low value of the dollar that I decided to make my own peanut butter and jelly sandwiches for lunches. At the end of my stay, I had some of the peanut butter and jelly left over in their jars, so I offered it to leave it for the 11 other young travelers in my room. One girl was from Australia. "Eeewww……!!" She said. "How could you even THINK of putting peanut butter and jelly together in the same sandwich!" I realized again how different people are based upon our likes, dislikes, opinions, feelings, thoughts, habits, ethnicity, backgrounds, culture, worldview, etc. In fact, one of the things I enjoy most about traveling the world is feeling the full impact of "difference".

Here at East Suburban Church we are always working on incorporating and celebrating the differences we find within our own people and among those around us. The principles we live by encourage this, with our UUA covenant to see the worth and dignity of every person, the free and responsible search for truth and meaning and the encouragement to spiritual growth for all of us.

Isn't it great to be part of such an open-minded group where we can think, explore and serve freely without worrying about whether or not we will be accepted? I hope we can always be so affirming of difference, especially as we find ourselves growing and bringing in new people all the time. We may not all like peanut butter and jelly in the same sandwich, but we can all accept the gift of difference that we bring to one another.
