This feels to me very much like a month of new beginnings as I prepare to travel to Uganda once again—this time with two other volunteers, to help lay bricks, train teachers, film a documentary, dedicate our newly purchased 5-acres of land and present gifts of computer equipment to kids and school staff over there.

Some of you have given financial support to this trip which I deeply appreciate. The African Rural Schools Foundation (ARSF) is a venture which I helped to start in 2005, in working with my teacher friend Hanan Bulime, whose vision of education for all African children is manifesting in positively beautiful ways.

The children are currently on summer vacation (southern hemisphere seasons are reversed) but last year's school enrollment was around 300, with a staff of 10. Before I leave Uganda for Pittsburgh on February 13, I hope to be able to speak to some of the returning students, and express to them our continuing support, love and partnership.

A high school senior and active UU named Will Delphia is one of the volunteers going with me to Uganda. He will be presenting the Sunday program on February 24, when he will tell us all about his great Ugandan adventure!

On November 25, 2007, the Finance Committee completed its annual internal review, and found no discrepancies pertaining to ESUUC's overall finances. Bank account balances are accurate and core record-keeping functions are in good order, including the proper tracking of profit and inventory associated with the Great Lakes Scrip (gift cards) fundraising initative. The profit from scrip sales benefits ESUUC's Coming of Age program.

At the start of the previous fiscal year (July 2006), when Cathy Serventi was treasurer, I began to process bank deposits, while Cathy took care of disbursements and the majority of ESUUC's financial record-keeping. Such a "separation of duties" helps to further safeguard church funds. Due to the present shortage of "people power," I'm now handling all receipts and disbursements. If you'd be willing to assist with the income side of the equation (the "fun" part, in my estimation), please contact me at treasurer@esuuc.org. Prospective candidates must have 1) an e-mail account, 2) a computer (ideally, with a scanner) and 3) be willing/able to process Sunday and other collections in a timely manner. Regular attendance at Sunday services is necessary, as bank deposits must be made quickly in order to prevent cash flow problems. If you
