

Sunday, March 2, 10:30 am — "*A Tale of Two Christianities*" -- There are many Christians among our neighbors, families and friends. But the label of "Christian" has such a broad spectrum of meanings, we can't possibly determine what a person believes until we engage them on some basic questions and issues. **Dr. Waun** will reflect on the idea (inspired by Marcus Borg) that there are two very different types of Christianity

Musings from the President: Annual Retreat by Matt Mathis

Our annual church retreat was focused on strengthening our interconnections as a congregation. We engaged in several community building exercises -- ok, games -- to help us discover some of the unexpected ways in which we are connected. There was much discussion about "six degrees of freedom", and how in today's globally interconnected world we are really one family. We were able to discover that all ESUUC members are no more than 2 or 3 handshakes away from Mahatma Gandhi and almost certainly as close or closer to all of our own political leaders.

The retreat was inspired by our 7th principle: "respect for the interdependent web of all existence, of which we are a part". This principle refers to both our interconnectedness within the human family as well as to the entire earth and its ecosystems. Although it is clear that "green" issues are still very high on everyone's priorities, one of the surprises of the retreat was discovering the extent to which peace has become the number one concern for many of our members. Clearly, as a congregation, we need to get more involved in the peace movement, both at the local level and within the Unitarian Universalist Association.

This does not mean that we are backing away from environmental issues. Quite the contrary: many people have voluntarily made specific changes in how we operate the church to lower our "carbon footprint". For example the new furnace for the classrooms is substantially more efficient than the old one. However, we still have not identified people willing to take on the planning and documentation necessary to complete formal green sanctuary certification.

News from the Treasurer

On January 19, I sent all contributing Members and Friends a report listing tax deductible donations (paid via cash, securities, or checks) made during calendar year 2007. For those with e-mail, you received this report electronically (to save the church the cost of postage), with a subject of "2007 ESUUC tax year data." If you didn't see such an item in your e-mail inbox, please check your spam folder, and also make sure you're set up to accept e-mail from my treasurer@esuuc.org address. For those without an e-mail address, I either hand-delivered a letter to you, or sent it via U. S. Mail. Please contact me with any questions or corrections.

Kudos to new member Kathy Leon for her suggestion of an easy way to raise funds for ESUUC, by using an Internet search engine called Goodsearch. Following is an excerpt from the Goodsearch web site (<u>http://www.goodsearch.com/About.aspx</u>):

"GoodSearch is a search engine which donates 50-percent of its revenue to the charities and schools designated by its users. It's a simple and compelling concept. You use GoodSearch exactly as you would any other search engine. Because it's powered by Yahoo!, you get proven search results. The money GoodSearch donates to your cause comes from its advertisers — the users and the organizations do not spend a dime!

"In 2007, GoodSearch was expanded to include GoodShop, an online shopping mall of world-class merchants dedicated to helping fund worthy causes across the country. Each purchase made via the GoodShop mall results in a donation to the user's designated charity or school – averaging approximately 3% of the sale, but going up to 20% or even more."

I'm in the process of establishing ESUUC as a participating Goodsearch charity. Stay tuned for more information regarding how you can use Goodsearch to help us raise some extra cash. In the meantime, let me know if you have any comments about or experience with this service.

Finally: Since we don't have a true bookkeeper to handle ESUUC's day-to-day finances, I'm still looking for an assistant treasurer who can help me by processing income and making bank deposits. If you're interested, please contact me at <u>treasurer@esuuc.org</u>. Prospective candidates must have 1) an e-mail account, 2) a computer (ideally, with a scanner) and 3) be willing/able to process Sunday and other collections in a timely manner. Regular attendance at Sunday services is necessary, as bank deposits must be made quickly to avoid cash flow problems. If you can't be available on a given Sunday, another board member or I will gladly fill in for you, provided we're notified in advance.

I hope everyone's 2008 is off to a great start. Make the best of winter while envisioning spring!
