2007 is announced as the "Year of Rumi" by UNESCO. Today, more than seven centuries later, Rumi's works continue to inspire people around the world, transcending all cultural and religious lines.

This wonderful event will start with an introductory speech on Rumi by **Dr. Paul Parker**, Professor and Chair of the Dept of Theology and Religion at Elmhurst College, Chicago. The ritual dance, called Sema, is among the most exquisite ceremonies of spirituality. The whirling of the dervishes is an act of love and a drama of faith, accompanied by beautiful, authentic Sufi music that echoes Rumi's poetry.
