Sunday, December 2, 10:30 am – "Thinking Outside the Box"- We have to face the fact that the way we interact with the world is shifting so rapidly we can hardly keep up with it. It is time to allow for different paradigms in this season of "peace and goodwill" as we see how we are really connected in deep and surprising ways to systems and people in far away lands. **Dr. Waun** will present.

Sunday, December 9, 10:30 am – "*Reflections on Death*" — As winter descends upon us, we recognize death as a part of the natural cycle of life, yet it is the rare individual who lets mortality into their consciousness. Death permeates human existence, yet we ignore it, particularly the church, which should be leading the way. Are we risking our happiness? Is there a healthier plan than living in denial?

Sunday, December 16, 10:30 am – "Christmas in Baghdad"— This new musical written our own David Schwartz uses traditional Christmas carols with new words to describe the U.S. involvement in Iraq and a plea for withdrawing the troops by Christmas and restoring peace. Sunday, December 23, 10:30 am – "Peace on Earth, Good Will to Men"— Wanda Guthrie, long-time peace activist (and Leona's mom), will discuss the prospects for peace in our time.

Monday, December 24, 7:30 pm – "Love Came Down at Christmas"-- Our annual traditional "story" centered Christmas Eve service will feature favorite carols, a book by Pearl S. Buck and the singing of "Silent Night" with hand held candles. **Dr. Waun** will facilitate.

Sunday, December 30, 10:30am -- "*Reflecting on the Holidays*" -- A panel of ESUUC members will discuss the many ways Unitarian families experience the holidays.

Sunday, Jan. 6, 10:30am- "Sex and Spirituality"—We don't usually address this subject in church, but perhaps it is time to explore how sexuality and spirituality are related, especially in our culture at a time in history when sex is such a central and formative focus. **Dr. Waun** will venture carefully into this minefield of a topic.

Finance Committee News

The Following is an excerpt from the Fall/Winter 2007 edition of the American Funds publication, "Investor." It may be of interest to our senior members and friends:

"Congress has provided an excellent tax incentive for charitable contributions, but you must act soon. The Pension Protection Act of 2006 allows individuals 70 1/2 and older to make tax-exempt charitable

contributions (limits apply) directly from their IRA assets to an eligible charity. The transaction must be made by December 31, 2007, as it is not certain that this provision will be extended. This legislation is good news for many IRA account holders 70 1/2 and older because this qualified charitable distribution, or QCD, satisfies the minimum distribution rule. In addition, WCD monies are excluded from adjusted gross income and, therefore, are tax-exempt."

For more information, and to see if this option is appropriate for you, please talk to your financial or tax adviser.

Rev. Waun Working to Launch Social Justice Charter School

Dr. Waun has been working with a group of creative thinkers in the Pittsburgh area to gain approval to start a charter school on the North Side. It will be called the Quest International Charter School; "international" because it will be the sister school of the one in Uganda.

So far, Quest has received a grant from the State of PA to help fund the proposal writing stage as well as the first three years of operating budget. The focus of the school will be social justice; promoting the "beloved community". It will use specialized curricula and teaching methods.

Currently they are seeking signatures for general and parent petitions to present to the Pittsburgh School Board in May, along with letters of support from community leaders and interested teachers.

Please visit http://www.questinternational.org for more information on the school as well as ways that you can help with getting petition signatures. Dr. Waun is happy to talk about Quest, and to answer questions you might have about this bold and life changing experiment.
